

Prompt starters:

You should prompt differently, depending on your purpose and the type of output you want to get. Here are some examples:

- You want something defined:
 - “Explain the concept / theory...”
- You want something summarized:
 - “Summarize this text with the 5 most important points...”
- You want to create an overview and insight:
 - “List the (x) most important...”
 - “Make a chronological overview of...”
 - “Describe the mechanisms behind...”
 - “Give examples of... Group the examples by (property, appearance, subject area...) and give each group a descriptive headline...”
- You want a comparison of two or more things or methods:
 - “List some advantages and disadvantages of...”
 - “Summarize similarities and differences between these concepts...”
- You want to improve your language:
 - “Correct punctuation and grammar in the following text...”
 - “Vary the language in the following text... Mark which words have been changed so I can accept or reject the change...”
- You want a suggestion or draft:
 - “Make a draft of a problem formulation that comes around...”
 - “Make an Instagram post with...”
- You want feedback:
 - “Challenge the points described in the following text...”
- You want input for your own reflection:
 - “How does this information relate to...”
 - “What criticisms have been raised against this theory?”
- You want input for your information search:

Use the output to ‘harvest’ good keywords. Chatbots are good at giving the English vocabulary used around a topic. Build on these keywords in your information search for real sources in e.g. Google, Google Scholar, EBSCO or PubMed.
