

## Bing, Bard, ChatGPT 3.5 and ChatGPT 4 – what is the difference?

If you don't have access to ChatGPT 4 or other paid large language models, you can still use generative AI. However, there are many differences in functionalities among the free tools. This overview can help you consider which tool that best suits your need.

NB: The overview is a snapshot of selected tools in January 2024: Since the tools evolve constantly you can't take the information for granted - be sure to check them yourself.

\* Bing is a search engine with built-in generative AI (Copilot) but it requires specific Microsoft licenses (e.g. Microsoft 365 and Windows 11). Users without Microsoft licenses can still use Bing as a free web-based search engine in the Edge browser, but without access to Copilot. The AI functions are provided by i.a. ChatGPT 4 and Dall-E.
